**Comment:** Overall, Delaware Part C saw a 6% increase in children exiting from the previous year. COVID played a large roll in the difference in percentages for many areas. There was a 37% decrease in children who exited the program by to completion of goals prior to age three because parents chose not to continue with services unless they were able to be conducted face to face. A 30% increase occurred in the number of children who turned three years old and were referred to other programs. This was due to parents choosing to stay with the program through the COVID crisis, and chose to accept resources for further assistance. Children exiting the program at age three with no referrals to other programs saw a 31% increase due to parents wanting to remain with Part C until their child turned three, however were not interested in receiving resources until the situation with COVID ended. Delaware census indicates that 4.1% of the race is of Asian decent. Our data coincides with the Delaware average by being at 4.8% of our total exiting population. Delaware Part C saw a 27% increase in parents identifying as Asian race from the previous year. Delaware census shows that .1% of the population reports being of Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander decent. Our data shows a slight increase of .4% of individual reporting as Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander for our population. While our numbers are higher than the Delaware average, there was still a 25% decrease in parents reporting as being of that Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander race. Delaware census shows that 2.7% of the population identify as being of more than one race. Our data show that 3.9% of our population identify as being of more than one race. Part C saw a 24% increase of parents identifying their children as being of more than one race.
