Comment: Delaware saw a 60% decrease in the number of parents identifying as American Indian/Alaskan Native. Delaware 2020 census indicates that parents identifying as American Indian/Alaskan Native are .7% of the overall population. This year our child count population for American Indian/Alaskan Native shows that we are at .17% which is higher than the State average. We also saw a 30% increase in parents identifying as Black/African American, from last year. Delaware's 2020 overall population for Black/African American is 23.2%. This year saw that 26% of our child count identified as Black/African American. Parents identifying as being of 2 or more races has increased 96% since last year. The Delaware 2020 census average shows that parents identifying as being of 2 or more races is at 2.7%. Our child count data show that we have 4% of our count as parents identifying as such.
