Comment: Birth to Three has seen a 5% increase in referrals in the past year, with an 8% increase in the number of children whose ages are between 24 and 36 months. With this increase in referrals within that age group, we had a 14% spike in the number of children exiting the program. There was a 13% increase of children Transitioning to Part B due to closer collaboration with the School Districts a well as the availability of virtual meetings, which makes it easier to schedule with the parents. The State had a 20% increase of children aging out of the program where they were not Part B eligible, and the parent has decided that they do not wish to be referred to other programs. An increase of 28% of children moved out of state with the majority of those being of the Hispanic ethnicity. This is due to the migrant status of the parents moving to where the work is. We had an increase of 40% of parents who lost contact with the program. Regional Programs have set measures in place to attempt to contact the family multiple times using different methods of communication. Family Service Coordinators also enlist the help of therapy providers and primary care physicians to gain access to parents. Even with these measures in place, parents remain unable to locate.
